Locally, he has worked on many critically-acclaimed productions, including *The Harp In The South, Blackie Blackie Brown*, and *Cloud Nine* (STC); *Mark Colvin's Kidney*, and *Seventeen* (Belvoir); *The Tempest* (Bell Shakespeare).

Nate was awarded the 2016 and 2015 Sydney Theatre Award for Best Score / Sound Design of an Independent Production; the 2020, 2018 and 2016 Broadway World Award for Best Score / Sound Design of a Play; the 2014 Brian Dyer Trophy for Best Score / Sound Design [UK] (*All My Sons*).

In 2019, Nate was nominated for a Helpmann Award for Best Sound Design for his work on *The Harp In The South*.
